




Timeline: December 2019 / January 2020

- Dec. 1: Presumed first case
- Dec 31: Wuhan China presents with dozens of new pneumonia cases
- Jan. 7: New coronavirus identified as cause.
- Jan. 11: China reports first death
- Jan. 20: Spread to Japan, South Korea, Thailand
- Jan. 21: First case in U.S. (Washington state)
- Jan. 23: China locks down Wuhan
- Jan. 30: WHO declares global health emergency
- Jan. 31: First cases confirmed in Italy

Timeline: February 2020

- Feb. 2: First death outside China (Philippines)
- Feb. 5: Diamond Princess cruise ship quarantined (Japan)
- Feb 6: Chinese whistleblower dies
- Feb. 10: China's death toll surpasses SARS
- Feb. 11: WHO changes name to COVID-19
- Feb. 14: First death outside of Asia (France)
- Feb. 19: Spreads to Iran
- Feb. 26: First case in South America (Brazil)
- Feb. 28: First case Sub-Saharan Africa (Nigeria)

Screening in the PICs

Plan:

- Specialized roster of healthcare workers
- Screening outside of hospitals
- Suspected patients go elsewhere

Rationale:

- Keep hospitals free of COVID patients
- Save on all resources
- Minimize preventable deaths







Are We Protecting Healthcare Workers?

- China: >3,400 healthcare workers COVID+
- Italy: >20 doctors dead
- Spain: 12% of cases are healthcare workers

Replace the mask with a new one as soon as it is damp and do not re-use single-use masks









Timeline: March 2020

- Mar. 5: WHO states death rate is 3.4%
- Mar. 11: WHO declares COVID-19 a pandemic
- Mar. 23: 177 countries and territories
- Mar. 26: Worldwide cases tops ½ million
- Mar. 27: >25K deaths
- Mar. 28-29: Italy and Spain pass China
- Mar. 30: Worldwide cases near ¾ million
- Mar. 30: >35K deaths



Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus

(Director-General)

- Jan. 21: First case in U.S. (Washington state)
- Feb. 28: First U.S. death
- Feb. 29: U.S. bans all travel to Iran
- Mar. 11: Rudy Gobert tests positive
- Mar. 27: U.S. becomes epicenter of pandemic
- Mar. 30: U.S. with 75% more cases than China






The US now has more confirmed cases of coronavirus than any other country.

Flattening the Curve





Treatment

- Symptomatic without hypoxia
 - o Go home
 - Possibly test (NP swab)
 - OTC meds
- Hypoxic or septic
 - Labs/CXR/admit
 - NP swab
 - False negatives up to 1/3
 - WARNING: Co-infection can occur
 - Early broad-spectrum antibiotics



Critical Care

- Things to avoid:
 - BiPAP and CPAP
 - BVM pre-oxygenation
 - Nebulizer Rx
- Delayed-sequence endotracheal intubation:
 - Full PPE or PAPR
 - Negative-pressure room
 - Two people in the room
 - Video-assisted
 - High-flow O₂ pre-oxygenation
 - Ketamine + Rocuronium
 - ETT/In-line suction/viral filter



The Ultimate Triage: ICU Beds and Ventilators

- Not enough ICU beds
 - o 95K in the U.S.
- Not enough ventilators
 - o 3 in Tonga (population 100K)
- Not enough healthcare workers
- Triage criteria and ethics
 - Age?
 - o Co-morbidities?
 - Frailty score?
 - Societal value?

- Immunization:
 - 12 to 18 months away
- An endemic disease?

5 Take-Home Points

- Assume everyone is COVID+
- Wash your hands
- Use the 6-foot rule
- Droplet precautions = a surgical mask
- Invasive respiratory procedures = an N95 (or PAPR)

What Is Going On? "An Emergency in Slow Motion"




- Lockdowns (China, Italy, Spain, France, USA)

A Pandemic of Fear in an Age of Chronic Disease

- People are anxious = unconstructive, extreme behavior
- People with chronic disease are justifiably scared
- Many are not able to manage uncertainty






